### Highlights

The Wells UK business remains in the Early Life Support (ELS) stage post the June Go-Live. There remains a delay in moving documents to the Record Centre due to changes to the document numbering schema. Remedy tickets are being monitored on a daily basis to ensure any requests are fixed and closed at the earliest opportunity. However, the number of bugs that exist and the re-appearance of previously resolved issues will likely delay the exit from ELS into Operate.

With regards to the migration of Documentum data from the remainder of the North Sea repositories, budget figures to reflect historical spend have been analysed to enable accurate forecasting. The project team has been increased with the additional support of a Senior Business Analyst (Manju Soni) who is supporting Colin Docherty to ensure the future phases of the North Sea project are accurately scoped, resourced and delivered on schedule. This approach will enable the North Sea project to proceed with confidence to the next stage of the project scope with anticipated Go-Lives during 2014 (primarily Midstream, Operations and Norway).

### Achievements:

Second successful visit to Norway with North Sea CIO to focus on some key problem areas. Achieved much clearer insight into how Atlas should work with Workmate.

Completed the migration strategy information overview which was presented to key UK Operations & IT&S staff with good feedback

### Highlights

BP TT Atlas went live on May 20<sup>th</sup>. The roll out of Brava viewer is in progress as a separate project. Brava viewer should be available to end users by the first week of October 2013.

### BP MOSS:

The migration of all content from MOSS to SharePoint 2010 Collaboration is planned in four waves. Each wave will migrate content/data for a specific set of functions/assets and will have its own go-live.

Read only period is required to ensure migration of the latest version of the documents. Users will be able to access the MOSS contents/documents but will not be able to edit or add new content.

A temporary SharePoint 2010 site will be provided to users to manage their documents/content during this read only period. After MOSS content has been migrated to SharePoint 2010, users can move their content from the temporary SharePoint 2010 site to SharePoint 2010 Collaboration space.

Three virtual trainings (instructor in US remotely leading the training for users in Trinidad & Tobago) will be available for end users with the final one scheduled for 20-Aug-13.

Wave 1 and Wave 2 went live on 01 Aug and 08 Aug respectively.

Wave 3 and Wave 4 is expected to go live on 21 Aug and 02 Sep respectively
